How an HSA works

- 1. Set it up and start saving With an HSA, you set aside pretax dollars to pay for qualified medical expenses. Since the funds you put into your HSA are used to pay for qualified expenses are tax free, you save money.
- 2. You and your employer contribute Both and your employer can contribute to your HSA, and you can add funds at any time or through automatic deductions each paycheck. In 2021, you can add up to \$3,600 for yourself or \$7,200 for your family each year. The money in the HSA is yours, and any funds left over at the end of the year can be rolled over to the next plan year.
- **3. Pay for medical expenses** You'll receive an HSA debit card you can use to pay for <u>qualified medical expenses</u> such as:
 - Costs that count toward your deductible.
 - Coinsurance.
 - O Copays.
 - Emergency room or urgent care visits.
 - Hospital stays.
 - Prescription drugs.
