Take a look and see what a difference enrolling in the HireRight 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") could make in achieving your goals.

Benefit from:

Matching contributions. Your company helps your contributions grow through an employer match—it's like getting "free" money. Please note that employer contributions are subject to your plan provisions. That's why it makes good financial sense to take advantage of this great benefit today!

Convenience. Your contributions are automatically deducted regularly from your paycheck.

Roth contributions. A Roth contribution to your retirement savings plan allows you to make aftertax contributions to your retirement savings plan and take any associated earnings completely tax free at retirement - as long as the distribution is a qualified one.

Tax savings now. Your pretax contributions are deducted from your pay before income taxes are taken out. This means that you can actually lower the amount of current income taxes you pay each period. It could mean more money in your take-home pay versus saving money in a taxable account.

Tax-deferred savings opportunities. You pay no taxes on any earnings until you withdraw them from your account, enabling you to keep more of your money working for you now.

Portability. You can rollover eligible savings from a previous employer into the Plan. You can also take your plan vested account balance with you if you leave the Company.

Investment options. You have the flexibility to select from investment options that range from more conservative to more aggressive, making it easy for you to develop a well-diversified investment portfolio.

Automatic annual increases. Save a little more each year, the easy way — the Annual Increase program automatically increases your contribution each year.

Online beneficiary. With Fidelity's Online Beneficiaries Service, you can designate your beneficiaries, receive instant online confirmation, and check your beneficiary information virtually any time.

Catch-up contributions. If you make the maximum contribution to your plan account, and you are 50 years of age or older during the calendar year, you can make an additional "catch-up" contribution of \$6,500 in 2022.

Frequently asked questions about your plan.

Here are answers to questions you may have about the key features, benefits, and rules of your plan.

When am I eligible for the Plan?

You are eligible upon employment. However, you are not eligible to participate if you are:

- A resident of Puerto Rico;
- Covered by a collective bargaining agreement that does not specifically provide for your participation in the Plan;
- A non resident alien with no income from a U.S. source;
- A leased employee as defined by the Plan;
- Classified by the Company as an independent contractor;
- A signatory to a contract, letter of agreement or other document that acknowledges your status as an independent contractor;
- An individual who performs services for the Company pursuant to an agreement between you and the Company which provides that you are not eligible to participate in the Plan.

How do I enroll in the Plan?

Enroll online at any time, or by calling the Fidelity Retirement Benefits Line at 1-800-835-5097.

When is my enrollment effective?

Your enrollment becomes effective once you elect a deferral percentage, which initiates the deduction of your contributions from your eligible compensation. Once you enroll, your contributions will begin being deducted from your paycheck, generally within two paydates.

What is the Roth contribution option?

A Roth contribution to your retirement savings plan allows you to make after-tax contributions and take any associated earnings completely tax free at retirement as long as the distribution is a qualified one. A qualified distribution, in this case, is one that is taken at least five tax years after your first Roth 401(k) contribution and after you have attained age 591/2, or become disabled or die. Through automatic payroll deduction, you can contribute between 1% and 60% of your eligible pay as designated Roth contributions, up to the annual IRS dollar limits.

How much can I contribute?

Through automatic payroll deduction, you may contribute between 1% and 60% of your eligible compensation per pay period on a pretax or Roth basis, up to the annual IRS dollar limits.

If you are under age 50, the IRS contribution limit for 2022 is \$20,500. If you will be at least age 50 during the year, your plan will allow you to defer an additional \$6,500 as catch-up contributions.

Can I change my contribution amount?

You can request to change your contribution amount virtually any time online or by calling the Fidelity Retirement Benefits Line at 1-800-835-5097.

In addition, you can automatically increase your plan contributions each year through the Annual Increase Program. To sign up, go FAQs

to the "Contribution Amount" section on NetBenefits[®], or call the Plan's toll-free number for more information.

To change your contribution percentage, go to the "Employee Benefits" tab on NetBenefits®, and go to "Contribution Amount" to enter your new contribution percentage. Your change will be effective generally within two paydates.

Does the Company contribute to my account?

Your Company will make a matching contribution in an amount equal to 100% of your deferral contributions up to 4% of your eligible compensation that you contribute to the Plan each pay period. Catch-up contributions are eligible for matching contributions.

What happens if I reach the annual IRS contribution limit during the year?

The payroll system will automatically stop your contributions once your contributions have reached the 2022 IRS limit of \$20,500 (or \$27,000 if you are age 50 or over). Your contributions will automatically resume again at your elected contribution percentage beginning with the first paycheck the next calendar year.

A few things to note about the annual IRS maximum:

- The annual IRS maximum applies to your contributions only.
- The maximum applies to all employee contributions you have made for the year under all 401(k) Plans. If you are a new hire and contributed to your prior employer's 401(k) plan during the year, you need to take into account the amount you contributed under your prior employer's plan when electing your contribution percentage. The payroll system will not take into account the amount you contributed to your prior employer's 401(k) plan when tracking the annual IRS limit.

Can I move money from another retirement plan into my account in the Plan?

You are permitted to roll over eligible pretax contributions from another 401(k) plan, 403(b) plan or a governmental 457(b) retirement plan account or eligible pretax contributions from conduit individual retirement accounts (IRAs). A conduit IRA is one that contains only money rolled over from an employer-sponsored retirement plan that has not been mixed with regular IRA contributions. After tax contributions, for example Roth 401(k) contributions, may not be rolled into the Plan. Additional information can be obtained online, or by calling the Fidelity Retirement Benefits Line at 1-800-835-5097. You should consult your tax adviser and carefully consider the impact of making a rollover contribution to your employer's plan because it could affect your eligibility for future special tax treatments.

Be sure to consider all your available options and the applicable fees and features of each before moving your retirement assets.

What are my investment options?

To help you meet your investment goals, the Plan offers you a range of options. You can select a mix of investment options that best suits your goals, time horizon, and risk tolerance. The investment options available through the Plan include conservative, moderately conservative, and aggressive funds. A complete description of the Plan's investment options and their performance, as well as planning tools to help you choose an appropriate mix, are available online.

When am I vested?

You are immediately 100% vested in your own contributions to the HireRight 401(k) Plan.

You are immediately 100% vested in your own contributions to the HireRight 401(k) Plan, **as well as in any of the organization's**

employer matching contributions and any earnings on them.

Can I take a loan from my account?

Although your plan account is intended for the future, you may borrow from your account for any reason. Generally, the Plan allows you to borrow up to 50% of your vested account balance. The minimum loan amount is \$1,000 and a loan must not exceed \$50,000. Any outstanding loan balances over the previous 12 months may reduce the amount you have available to borrow. You may have one loan outstanding at a time. Only one loan may be initiated within each calendar year. The maximum loan repayment period is five years unless the loan is for the purchase of your principal residence in which case the loan repayment period may not extend beyond 10 years from the date of the loan. You repay the amount borrowed, plus interest, through automatic after-tax payroll deductions. The cost to initiate a loan is \$75, and there is a guarterly maintenance fee of \$6.25. The initiation and maintenance fees will be deducted directly from your individual Plan account. If you fail to repay your loan (based on the original terms of the loan), it will be considered in "default" and treated as a distribution, making it subject to income tax and possibly to a 10% early withdrawal penalty. Defaulted loans may also impact your eligibility to request additional loans. Be sure you understand the Plan rules and impact of taking a loan before you initiate a loan from your plan account.

Can I make withdrawals from my account?

Withdrawals from the Plan are generally permitted when you terminate your employment, retire, reach age 59½, become permanently disabled, or have severe financial hardship as defined by your plan. Learn more about and/or request a withdrawal online, or by calling the Fidelity Retirement Benefits Line at 1-800-835-5097.

When you leave the Company, you can withdraw contributions and any associated

earnings or, if your vested account balance is greater than \$5,000, you can leave contributions and any associated earnings in the Plan. After you leave the Company, if your vested account balance is equal to or less than \$1,000, it will automatically be distributed to you. However, if your vested account balance is greater than \$1,000 but not more than \$5,000, you will be notified that your entire vested account balance will be transferred to an Individual Retirement Account (Rollover IRA), unless you request either a cash distribution or a rollover distribution of your choice.

Fund Objective: The investment seeks to generate current income consistent with preservation of capital.

Fund Strategy: The fund invests at least 80% of its net assets in fixed-income securities. It invests significantly in fixed-income securities of non-U.S. companies. The fund normally invests in the fixed-income securities of companies located in at least three countries. It may invest in a broad range of fixed-income securities in both developed and emerging markets. The fund may invest across all fixed-income sectors, including U.S. and non-U.S. government and corporate debt securities.

What is the Roth 401(k) Contribution Option?

A Roth contribution is available to employees who participate in the 401(k) plan. For payroll purposes, Roth contributions are treated as after tax. This feature will allow participants to make Roth contributions to their plan while taking their earnings completely **tax-free** at retirement—as long as the withdrawal is a qualified one. A qualified withdrawal is one that can be taken five tax years after the year of the first Roth contribution *and* after the participant has attained age 59½, has become disabled, or has died.

If you qualify to make traditional 401(k) contributions, you are eligible for a Roth 401(k) contribution.

How does a Roth 401(k) contribution option work?

You elect an amount of your salary that you wish to contribute to the Roth source, just as you would for your traditional 401(k). The contribution is based on your eligible compensation, not on your net pay — for example, if your total annual eligible compensation is \$40,000 per year and you elect a 6% deferral amount, then \$2,400 per year would go into your Roth 401(k) account.

Unlike your traditional 401(k) pretax contribution, with a Roth 401(k) contribution, you pay the taxes now on the contributions you make—but later your earnings are all tax-free, if you meet certain criteria.

Example: Sally earns \$40,000 and has elected to put 6% toward her Roth 401(k) contributions and 6% toward her traditional 401(k) pretax contributions on a monthly basis.

Your combined Roth and traditional pretax 401(k) contributions cannot exceed the IRS limits for the year.

Would a Roth 401(k) contribution option benefit me?

The potential benefits of Roth 401(k) contributions really depend on your personal situation, but are mainly focused on your existing tax rate and your anticipated tax rate at the time of retirement. If you are contributing to a Roth, you are giving up a tax break today for a tax break in the future.

Therefore, a Roth contribution might benefit you if your tax rate in retirement were **higher** than it had been during the years you contributed.

If your tax rate were **lower** in retirement, then a traditional 401(k) might be more beneficial to you than the Roth option. Talk with a tax professional for more information on how to determine if Roth 401(k) contributions are right for you.

Is a traditional pretax 401(k) still beneficial?

Yes. For many participants, a traditional pretax 401(k) will still be the most beneficial type of retirement savings plan. We do not know what the future holds regarding tax rates. Therefore, it is not possible to predict with certainty which type of 401(k) savings will be most beneficial to a participant.

Remember, because Roth 401(k) contributions are made after tax, you may take home less money in your paycheck than you would if you contributed to a traditional pretax 401(k).
